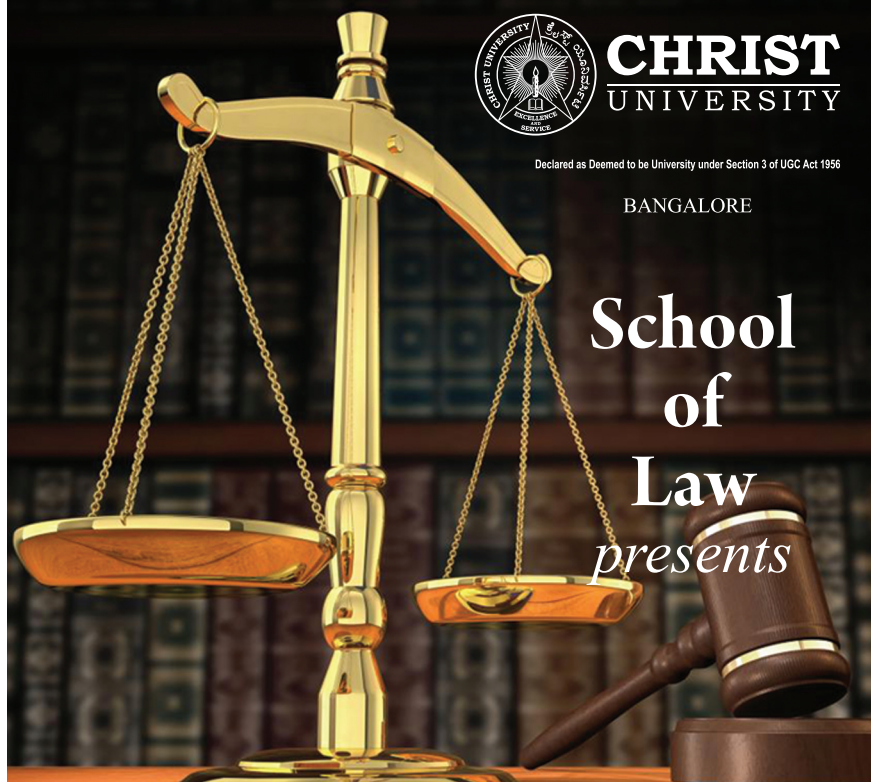

- Send the full paper not exceeding 2500 words on acceptance of the abstract.
- The articles will be published as a book with ISBN number.
